THIS YEAR'S CLAIM:

WITHOUT WATER, IT'S IMPOSSIBLE

Water - the fountain of life, the basic building block of our planet and a resource we often take for granted. But water is much more than just the liquid we drink every day. It is a mirror of our environment, a reflection of our actions and inactions. At a time when climate change is affecting our planet with unprecedented intensity, we need to realise the importance of water to our lives and to the life of the entire ecosystem. This year's edition of the EKOFILM film festival is subtitled "Without water, it's impossible." We want to introduce you to films that show the importance of water in different parts of the world, its quality, as well as the problems associated with its scarcity. In our country, we may think that we will never run out of water. But even here, we are beginning to feel the effects of drought, bark beetles are attacking weakened forests and cities are turning into hot islands.

The festival films will offer different perspectives on the issue of water, from its importance to nature to the social impact of water scarcity. We hope that you will find those that appeal to you and inspire you to treat water with respect and responsibility.

The festival includes a number of supporting events, meetings with filmmakers, talks and workshops. This time with Jan Bendig in the Old Town Hall courtyard. The programme and screenings will take place from Thursday to Sunday in Cinema Art, Cinema City, the Brno Zoo and other Brno venues. Whether you are a film enthusiast or just interested in environmental issues, we believe that this year's EKOFILM will offer you a lot of inspiration and new insights.

We hope you enjoy your film days full of inspiration and new discoveries. Water is our common wealth and it is up to us to protect it for future generations.

PETR HLADÍK

We often say that we are proud of our nature. We like to spend our free time in it, whether actively exploring or relaxing. That's why it's good that Europe's oldest nature festival is located here. EKOFILM has been with us for almost half a century, and this is the first time that I am going to attend in my role as Minister for the Environment. JURY



TUIJA HALTTUNEN

Tuija Halttunen is a Finnish filmmaker who has worked in the film industry for over twenty years. Her latest feature documentary How to Kill a Cloud was a festival success and was awarded for example in Locarno FF and Jihlava IDFF. Her film Neighbours was nominated for Prix Europa and her first feature length documentary State of Mind got a state's quality award. She has been described as an original filmmaker with a strong own voice.



NATÁLIA PAŽICKÁ

Environmental activist, influencer, founder of the initiative and civic association #everyindividualmatters and the podcast Fashion Session. Through modelling, she was able to see for herself the unfortunate practices of the fashion industry in Chinese factories. She then decided to study fashion and branding at the Amsterdam Fashion Institute, where she spent 4 years working on sustainability in the fashion industry. She is also one of the initiators of the country's most successful online petition #climateneeds, which has received more than 130,000 signatures. In 2021, she won the Forbes 30 under 30 award.



VERONIKA ČERMÁK MACKOVÁ

Actress, animal lover, traveller and environmental enthusiast, supporter of biodiversity conservation projects with which she has long cooperated. She tries to connect ecology with her profession and bring important topics to people through education. On her conservation journey, she was most influenced by her visits to the Republic of Congo, where she saw the beautiful wilderness with Save-Elephants organization.

JURY



JAN E. SVATOŠ

A winner of two special awards of Special Jury Award and an author of more than 15 documentaries, most of which were entered into competitions and were awarded in International film festivals. His the most successful films are The Ark of Lights and Shadows, divoČINY, Africa Obscurg. Nobody Asked and When the Lion Roars. Jan has long collaborated with Czech Television and Czech Radio, and his projects have involved major figures from the world of film - Werner Herzog, Jane Goodall and David Bordwell. He currently teaches documentary film at the Miroslav Ondříček Film Academy in Písek.



MARTIN ČECH

A Czech cameraman and documentarian, a member of the Film and Television Academy and the Association of Czech Cinematographers, a teacher, and a graduate of FAMU in Prague. In 1999, he was awarded a Český lev prize as a cameraman on the Kuře melancholik film. He participated in a couple of features and many TV programmes. He made his mark as a documentarian with Kristova léta, dámy... documentarv, which was awarded first prize at the FINALE PLZEŇ film festival in 2004. He makes feature films and documentaries. He has visited over sixty countries with his camera. Recently, he has participated in a film Milan Kundera: From Joke to Meaninglessness and he is shooting a film about the memories and work of director Miloš Forman in the USA. Last vear he completed a feature film for theatres, Cherchez la femme, which is a relationship comedy starring the Czech actress Hanka Wagnerova.

PROGRAM DEPARTMENT

In total 25 films from 15 countries will compete for five **EKOFILM** awards. The majority of our competition films come from Europe and there are also films from Canada and Brazil. The Czech Republic is represented by four documentaries. The films were selected out of 142 submissions by the **EKOFILM** programmers led by Jitka Kotrlová.



IITKA KOTRLOVÁ

Festival programmer and producer litka Kotrlová studied Film Studies at the Faculty of Arts, Charles University, and Film Production at FAMU. As a programmer, she has worked with a number of Czech film festivals (KVIFF, Finále Plzeň, Ostrava Kamera Oko, Prague IFF - Febiofest, among others). She is the producer of Central Bus Station, Killing of the Journalist and the feature Snowing!. Currently, among other film projects, she is making documentaries with environmental themes - Ent (directed by Tomáš Elšík) and Who's Missing Here Today? (directed by Květa Chaloupková).

ZUZANA ČERNÁ

Festival programmer and film historian Zuzana Černá studied at the Film Studies Department, Charles University. She worked at the programming department of Prague IFF – Febiofest and has worked for other film festivals, such as Ostrava Kamera Oko. She also works as a sales agent for the production company Negativ.



HANA BLAHA ŠILAROVÁ

Film producer and festival programmer Hana Blaha Šilarová has worked on a wide range of films. Her films include the VR movie Darkening and the documentary The Investigator. She is currently working for instance on the fiction movie Homeland, the documentary Garden of Dreams and the historical series Three Against the Gestapo. She selects documentaries for the East Silver market and for KVIFF. She studied Film Production at FAMU and Film Studies at the Faculty of Arts, Charles University.

PROGRAM DEPARTMENT





Martin Čech studied Environmental Studies and Media Studies and Journalism at the Masaryk University in Brno. He has been involved in the preparation of the EKOFILM festival for five years, where he is responsible for the industry programme; already seven years ago he started working in the festival's programming department. He also works in processing of research projects focused on environmental and social topics. In the organization NaZemi he focuses on degrowth theory, about which he lectures and writes texts.



TOMÁŠ POŠTULKA

Tomáš Poštulka studied Film Studies and Media Studies. He worked at the PR department of the Academia Film Olomouc festival and at MFDF Ji.hlava. He is currently a programmer at the One World film festival. At EKOFILM, he is responsible for international film scouting.

SECTIONS OF COMPETING FILMS

BEAUTY OF NATURE

The Beauty of Nature section shows films from different corners of the world and explores current social topics. Films in this section bring to the big screen the diversity of the planet's nature. They also point to the fact that we have to take care of it to be able to preserve its beauty for the next generations. This year, the section brought together films that touch on the beauty of nature but also raise the question of how to protect it not only from climate change but also from human activity.

VISIONS OF NATURE

Visions of Nature section focuses on medium-length films that cover environmental themes from around the world. The main connection between all the selected films is the unique perspective of the filmmakers bringing new perspectives to familiar issues related to the climate crisis. Climate change can no longer be ignored, and many processes leading to saving the planet and natural recovery are already underway - but are the solutions chosen always sustainable? This year's selection of films highlights their shortcomings and offers a vision of where to go next.

IN SHORT

The short film section offers a wide range of approaches to environmental topics from all corners of the world – from Canada and France to Finland and Brazil. A selection of playful and serious, but mainly topical, short films describing the world around us.

BEAUTY OF NATURE



THE VISITORS

Czech Republic

director: Veronika Lišková

83 min

A young anthropologist, Zdenka, moves with her husband and three sons to Svalbard, Norway. She has received a prestigious two-year grant to carry out extensive research on the impact of globalization on the inhabitants of the world's northernmost town, Longyearbyen. After falling in love with her new home, Zdenka discovers that more than icebergs and permafrost are vanishing in the Arctic. She begins to perceive how heterogeneous the small local community actually is, while also revealing tensions that lie beneath the surface.







A CRACK IN THE MOUNTAIN

United Kingdom

Deep in the jungle of Central Vietnam, lies a magnificent underground kingdom. Hang Son Doong which translates as "mountain river cave", is the largest cave passage in the world and a place of spectacular beauty. In 2014, Son Doong's future was thrown into doubt when plans were announced to build a cable car into the cave. With many arguing that this would destroy its delicate eco-system and the local community divided over the benefits this development would bring, the film follows those caught up in the unfolding events.







WILD PRAGUE

How many "inhabitants" are there in Prague? This time, the creators of the award-winning film Planet Czechia set out on an expedition into the concrete jungle of the capital. Alongside us, humans, live a whole host of unexpected animal neighbours, whose daily adventures the filmmakers have captured with state-of-the-art technology at extraordinary proximity. Where do the majestic mouflons come from in Prague? What winter hideout does the cute dormouse hide in on Petřín Hill? Embark on an exciting expedition for the whole family to discover dozens of other animal heroes who secretly live in our metropolis







GRAND CANYON

The Grand Canyon documentary tells the story of Slovak boaters following their dream. They have been down many rivers and canyon crossings in different parts of the world. Their biggest challenge is to conquer the Grand Canyon, for which they have been preparing for several years. They are determined to spend a month on the wild water embracing untamed nature.







URAK LAWOI, BROTHERS OF THE SEA

The Sea Brotherhood (Urak Lawoi in their native language) is a nomad tribe that for hundreds of years, has been looking for a place to settle. A 100 years ago, the Thai government conceded the island of Koh Lipe and the Adang archipelago, to its aboriginal inhabitants. Since then, the Sea Brotherhood has overcome natural and human disasters, thanks to their profound knowledge about fishing and the sea. In this film, we will see how this peculiar culture and identity, with its age-old relationship with the ocean, is threatened by climate change, marine pollution & the tourist.







NORTHERN FORESTS

North of Istanbul new superhighways cuts through formerly protected forests, pastures and farmland. The residents are presented with a fait accompli, their villages turned into city suburbs and all agricultural activities will become illegal. After the completion of the 3rd bridge and the gigantic airport hub, the construction of the Istanbul Canal is about to begin. Facing the anger and disappointment of the residents in countless local grassroots assemblies, the activist group struggles to establish common goals among the people.







ASHES OF THE FOREST



Ashes of the Forest is a documentary feature, an art exhibition, and a vehicle in support of the volunteer firefighting brigades in Brazil all at once. The film follows street artist Mundano as he travels through a burning Brazil, collecting ashes from wildfires to create the paint used in his latest artwork, in the context of climate change in the Amazon. The project aims to promote art as activism and to raise awareness about the importance of protecting forests and fighting fires today.

ORGANIZED WILDERNESS

Denmark ranks second as the most cultivated country in the world, right after Bangladesh, and over the last 20 years, 80 percent of local species are extinct. Now is the time to do something about it and help biodiversity back on track. Organized Wilderness follows Denmark's largest rewilding project in Hammer Bakker in the Northern Jutland and examines the confusion that arises as we humans try to restore our connection with nature. Where is the line between nature and culture? Can humans work together to bring back nature? And ultimately, how wild do we want nature to be?







RAID ON THE ATLANTIC

West African waters have long been among the richest in the world. But since the 1970s, European, Russian and even Asian fishing fleets have been raiding this part of the Atlantic Ocean, often illegally. This competition from foreign trawlers has terrible consequences for local artisanal fishermen. But some Senegalese are fighting back and do not accept this situation. Karim Sall, a fisherman unionist, and Diaba Diop, the leader of the women's fish processing union, are fighting tirelessly to make their voices heard by the Senegalese government and international institutions.







INVISIBLE LANDSCAPES

"A large part of the phenomena surrounding us in our daily lives is completely hidden from our sight. Mysterious worlds of sounds, echoes, and vibrations form networks of extraordinary invisible landscapes around us. Have you ever wondered what the roar of water and heat in the bowels of a thermal power station or the steady breathing of an oil rig sound like? A film full of bustle and sounds, yet one that is nearly wordless, offering a unique perspective on ecology and energy. There are many other ways to see the world than merely with our eyes.







WATER LOST AND RETURNED

An emotional artistic documentary about the return of wetlands to the landscape of the Šumava National Park. The unique shots of Radek Plíhal, captured during a three-year filming in the fascinating environment of Šumava, completed with the music of Lenka Dusilová and Petr Ostrouchov, tell the story of water. The story of her journey starting in the forest springs, wet meadows and bogs, passing through the streams to the river floodplain. The story of her deliberate damnation not long ago and the efforts of hundreds of people to bring it back. The film depicts the fundamental importance of water for the landscape, nature and for the unceasingly diverse life it brings.







DEATH AT THE ZOO – WHY ZOOS KILL HEALTHY ANIMALS

"One day they are still the attraction of the zoo, the next day they end up as food for other zoo animals. What is everyday life in many zoos around the world is incomprehensible for many zoo visitors. That's why zoos don't like to talk about it. German filmmakers have now, for the first time, succeeded in persuading two zoos to deal openly with this difficult subject. The film poses the provocative question of whether it might not make sense for zoo animals to become food animals. The answers are surprising and perhaps even frightening for many Zoo fans.







OUTGROW THE SYSTEM

"Change the system, not the climate" is a common demand in the climate movement. But what kind of system do we actually want? In the midst of humanity's worst crisis, the pioneers stand ready. Meet the new economic perspectives that have the potential to change the world at its core.







GREENWASHING: THE CLIMATE KILLER

Faced with consumer pressure amid the climate crisis, multinationals increasingly vaunt their commitment to "carbon neutrality". But can we believe their claims of 'net zero' or is this simply greenwashing? Many of these large companies rely on carbon offsetting to burnish their green credentials, financing 'ecological' projects like tree plantations via carbon credits rather than reducing emissions. However, very often these projects are not effective or may even have a negative impact on the environment and local populations. We investigate the validity of claims of big companies like Total Energies or Nespresso, who has pledged that "every cup of coffee will be carbon neutral by 2022".







DOWN TO THE LAST DROP

This documentary film deals with the planned construction of a new hydropower plant chain that is to extend over the entire Ötztal Alps. These interventions would also irrevocably change the Ötztaler Ache - the last major glacier river in Austria that has not been massively affected by energy use. And all this in the midst of the biodiversity crisis and the looming climate catastrophe. The more we learn about these great crises of our time the more we understand the situation - do we really want to still be using old recipes?







THE SECRET OF THE FORGOTTEN RUINS - HOW NATURE CONQUERS HABITATS

Man against nature - nature against man. Powerful opponents. Photographer Sven Fennema follows their struggle - in lost and abandoned places, like one in northern Italy. 





Hannele Korhonen, an ambitious Finnish meteorologist, has been studying clouds all her life. Their essence is chemical, physical and metaphysical. Due to funding constraints on her research, she decides to take up the Faustian challenge of a wealthy sheikh from the United Arab Emirates and apply for a scientific tender. Research into the creation of artificial rain in arid desert land is fraught with a number of moral dilemmas. An ambient, fragile film about clouds, cultural practices and the temptations of environmental engineering. Fragments of destruction wrapped in a meditative flow of aerosol images.

GLOBAL CHANGE RESEARCH OF THE ACADEMY OF SCIENCES OF THE CZECH REPUBLIC

Global Change Research Institute of the Czech Academy of Sciences - CzechGlobe is a European centre of excellence investigating ongoing global change and its impacts on the biosphere and human society. The research focuses in particular on climate change and its future scenarios, the carbon cycle and the impacts of changing conditions on the production and biodiversity of ecosystems and the implications for development and societal behaviour.

Given the theme of this year's EKOFILM, which is water, colleagues from the Landscape Ecosystem Services Analysis Department will demonstrate the interlinkages between ecosystem services through several practical demonstrations. They will show the link between the character of agricultural land use, the ecological condition of water formations and the impact of selected nature-based measures to mitigate the effects of environmental change.



CZECH HYDROMETEOROLOGICAL INSTITUTE IN BRNO


BOTANICAL GARDEN AND ARBORETUM OF MENDEL UNIVERSITY IN BRNO
