THIS YEAR'S FOCUS

CLIMATE CHANGE

Few things are as important as our environment. Climate change, which we have also been experiencing in the Czech Republic for the last few years, is increasingly resonating as a topic. Thanks to the Internet, we now know within minutes what is sitting on the other side of our planet. This makes it all the more possible for us to realise how fast climate change is happening and how serious the issue is.

That is why we have chosen climate as the main theme of our festival this year. In September 2022, when we are preparing the 48th edition of the EKOFILM, the biggest humanitarian disaster of the 21st century is happening in Pakistan, a country just 5,000 km away, due to the climate there. The floods have affected more than 15 percent of Pakistan's population, approximately more than 33 million people. That is three times the population of the Czech Republic. Can you imagine that? These are the real impacts of climate change on planet Earth. But there are also places where, on the contrary, water has disappeared completely, and this change has displaced millions of people who have lost their homes.

Environmental and climate issues are moving public opinion all over the world. Because the changes on our planet are becoming more and more evident. The big question for the guests at this year's EKOFILM will be how to prepare our landscapes and cities for changing conditions, how to preserve water in the landscape, how to provide enough food and energy while reducing the impact of our actions on the planet and stopping the changes that our civilisation is triggering by these actions.

Films and discussions will highlight environmental problems, how to openly seek possible solutions, and reveal hope for the way forward. The change we have started cannot be stopped by turning a single button on our planet's control panel. We all have the opportunity to do something.

FESTIVAL VIRTUAL REALITY: CLIMATIC CHANGE IN THE LANDSCAPE

This year again at the ECODOME on Liberty Square you will visit many interesting places through virtual reality. The 360° video goggles will bring you closer to the landscape from a point of view you won't be familiar with.

We will show you the climate, which is the theme of this year's festival, as you can experience it yourself on your walks in Bohemia. The only difference is that in three minutes you will travel through the whole of Central Europe. You will visit the deep forests of Brdy, the dry land-scapes of southern Moravia, the ponds of central Bohemia, the meadows of the Elbe plain or the high peaks of the Slovenian mountains. You will learn about the composition of the atmosphere and what is the biggest problem in climate change. This is now a very hot topic because it also threatens the human species.

Our festival's virtual reality will present the behind-the-scenes of climate in the landscape and highlight the context, which you will only realise when you visit places that bring this topic literally "in front of everyone's eyes" thanks to VR glasses.

You can visit the virtual reality every festival day, on Thursday and Friday from 12 a.m. to 6 p.m. and on Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

EVA HOLUBOVÁ

Eva Holubová is an actress, winner of the Czech Lion for her supporting role in the film Ene bene. She was also nominated for this award for her supporting roles in the films Cosy Dens, Buttoners and Skřítek. For her portrayal of the mother in the film Holiday Makers, she received the award for "Best Performance by an Actress" at the 2006 Tribeca Film Festival in New York. In addition to film work, she has guest starred in numerous theatres and is also active on Instagram together with daughter Karolina. She is involved in charity work and politics. Her name is associated with the avant-garde scene of the Sklep, where she performed and which influenced her further artistic direction. Her first prominent role is that of a governess in Filip Renč's 1991 drama Requiem for a Doll.



ADÉLA KOMRZÝ

The director Adéla Komrzý studied Art History at Charles University and graduated from the Department of Documentary Filmmaking at FAMU. As part of her studies. she participated in an internship at the Babelsberg Konrad Wolf Film School. She was nominated for the Pavel Koutecký Award for her film Viva video, video viva about the pioneers of Czech video art. Her film Unit of Intense Life had its world premiere at the Karlovy Vary IFF in the competition section From East to West and received two awards. In addition, the film was awarded the Czech Lion and the Czech Film Critics' Prize. She also gained experience working on the HBO miniseries The Burning Bush. Her latest film. The Art Test (co-directed with Tomáš Bojar), won the main prize in the Proxima Competition at the Karlovy Vary IFF 2022, where it had its world premiere.



MARTIN ČECH

A Czech cameraman and documentarian, a member of the Film and Television Academy and the Association of Czech Cinematographers, a teacher, and a graduate of FAMU in Prague. In 1999, he was awarded a Český lev prize as a cameraman on the Kuře melancholik film. He participated in a couple of features and many TV programmes. He made his mark as a documentarian with Kristova léta, dámy... documentary, which was awarded first prize at the FINÁLE PLZEŇ film festival in 2004. He makes feature films and documentaries. He has visited over sixty countries with his camera. Recently, he has participated in a film Milan Kundera: From Joke to Meaninglessness and he is shooting a film about the memories and work of director Miloš Forman in the USA. He is currently completing a feature film for theatres, "Cherchez la femme", which is a relationship comedy starring the Czech actress Hanka Wagnerova.





Film director and film critic. **FIPRESCI** Editor-in-Chief. She worked as a director and screenwriter, creating media content for non-governmental organizations and socially responsible businesses such as WWF, OSCE, and UN, with a special focus on projects related to the Fast of Ukraine, Author of a series of video lectures and a book dedicated to Ukrainian poetic cinema. She is also a program coordinator of the OKO International Ethnographic Film Festival. After the outbreak of war in Ukraine, she became a part of the EnegraCamerimage International Film Festival of the Art of Cinematography (Poland).



MARTIN ŠRAJER

Graduate of the Prague Department of Film Studies, film publicist, editor of Film and Time and Film Review, an employee of the National Film Archive and expert of the State Cinematography Fund. He regularly collaborates with domestic film festivals, writes freelance for Aktuálně, A2larm, Cinepur and Seznam Zprávy. He watches films and series, reads, writes, thinks, hopes, doubts and refuses to give up on the idea of a fairer world.



JAN E. SVATOŠ

A winner of two special awards of Special Jury Award and an author of more than 15 documentaries. most of which were entered into competitions and were awarded in International film festivals. His the most successful films are The Ark of Lights and Shadows, divoČI-NY, Africa Obscura, Nobody Asked and When the Lion Roars. Jan has long collaborated with Czech Television and Czech Radio, and his projects have involved major figures from the world of film - Werner Herzog, Jane Goodall and David Bordwell. He currently teaches documentary film at the Miroslav Ondříček Film Academy in Písek.



BLAŽENA HUŠKOVÁ

An author, implementor and consultant on a range of projects in the area of protection of nature and landscape, education and the interpretation of local heritage. She co-founded and led the Foundation for Jizera Mountains. For over 20 years she was a member of the board of directors in Foundation Relationships.

In recent years, she has been professionally involved in so-called place-based learning with a focus on schools and educators. She is currently completing a book that focuses on teachers' experiences of teaching children in their local context.

PROGRAM DEPARTMENT

In total 25 films from 15 countries will compete for five **EKOFILM** awards. The majority of our competition films come from Europe and there are also films from Australia, Canada and Chile. The Czech Republic is represented by three documentaries. The films were selected out of 243 submissions by the **EKOFILM** programmers led by Jitka Kotrlová.



IITKA KOTRLOVÁ

Festival programmer and film producer. She graduated in Film Science from the Faculty of Arts at Charles University and in Production from the Film and TV School of the Academy of Performing Arts (FAMU). She has worked for numerous Czech film festivals (Karlovy Vary IFF, Finále Plzeň, Ostrava Kamera Oko, Prague IFF – Febiofest) as dramaturge or film industry organiser. She produced a documentary *Central Bus Station* and live action film *Snowing!*

ZUZANA ČERNÁ

The festival programmer film historian. Zuzana Černá. graduated in Film Studies with a master's degree from Charles University in Prague. She works in the programme department of the Prague IFF - Febiofest, as well as for other film festivals. such as Ostrava Kamera Oko. She also works with the National Film Archive, notably in oral history, i.e. the discipline that contributes to the knowledge of our history through the memories of eye witnesses.



HANA BLAHA ŠILAROVÁ

Film producer and festival programmer Hana focuses mainly on debuts and second films. Her finished films include the documentaries Skutok sa stal and Budovatelé říše. She is currently preparing the film Vyšetřovatel and is developing, for example, the VR film Tmání, the acted film Domovina and the documentary Human Beeing. She selects documentaries for the East Silver market and the Karlovy Vary IFF. She graduated in Production from the Film and TV School of the Academy of Performing Arts (FAMU) and in Film Studies from the Faculty of Arts at Charles University.

He has worked at the Ji.hlava International Film Festival and is currently the dramaturg for the One World Festival. He was the chief editor of the Pastiche Filmz film club and works as a dramaturg and scriptwriter for the film section of the Nabalkoně students' society.

SECTIONS OF COMPETING FILMS

BEAUTY OF NATURE

The Beauty of Nature section shows films from different corners of the world and exploring current social topics. Films in this section bring to the big screen the diversity of the planet's nature. They also point to the fact that we have to take care of it to be able to preserve its beauty for the next generations. The path to responsibility as individuals and as society is the section's topic for this year.

CENTRAL EUROPEAN FILMS

The section focuses on topics that weigh down on authors in Central Europe; however, it is not reduced to local topics, but addresses the whole world. No problems are exclusively our own; they may also affect people on the other side of the world. Films in this year's edition are proof that if people are interested and engaged, this can be the main factor that changes the way we treat the planet. Although the path is often challenging, a positive approach helps us find meaningful solutions and can affect the way society as a whole functions.

SHORT FILMS

The Shorts Competition offers a wide range of approaches to environmental topics from all corners of the world – from the USA and the Netherlands to India and Australia. A selection of playful, inspiring and up-to-date short documentary or animated movies is entertaining in their approach and in being spot on.

FINITE: THE CLIMATE OF CHANGE

Inside the core of the climate movement, concerned citizens in Germany put their bodies on the line to save the ancient Hambach Forest from Europe's largest coal mine. They form an unlikely alliance with a frustrated community in rural England who are forced into action to protect their homes from a new mine. Finite is an insider's view of the world of direct action; an authentic insight into the David and Goliath battle between frontline communities, activists and fossil fuel corporations.

Masht Hussein is a rancher, a reasonable human being who has a great deal of respect for nature. Everyday for more than thirty years, kindly and without any help, he has been walking several kilometers through impassable high land to water the thirsty animals and birds in the area where drought and aridity have made the living difficult for them. You can feel life in the area under his care. At the end of the difficult path and after completing an arduous task, Masht Hussein, tired yet happy, watches birds and animals drink water and enjoys it.







NAMASTE HIMALAYA - HOW A VILLAGE IN NEPAL OPENED THE WORLD TO US

At the outbreak of the pandemic, two world travellers Anna and Michael are stranded in one of the poorest countries in the world. When Nepal suddenly announces a lockdown and seals off its cities, they flee into the mountains. At the foot of the eight-thousands they find refuge and a corrugated iron roof over their heads. As food becomes scarce and hunger sets in, cohesion grows. Field workers, beggars and mountain guides become their friends – and the two of them become students of a philosophy of life and nature.







SHEPHERDS OF THE EARTH

The area in Turkana, Kenya, known as the Cradle of Humankind, is now-adays inhabited by an indigenous pastoral tribe called Daasanach. Two European biologists are impressed by the traditional fables and animal stories of the tribe. The stories paint a picture of vivid nature and rich wildlife. But while exploring the surroundings, the biologists discover a dry and bare landscape with hardly any animals left. The two worlds collide revealing the importance of wildlife and nature for both.







AFTER NATURE

Of all the Anthropocene crises, the biodiversity crisis is in many ways the most irreversible and worrying. Earth's species are dying out at such a staggering rate that scientists are now talking about a mass extinction. In After Nature, four prominent scientists and one artist unfold how humanity's pursuit of wealth and prosperity has degraded the living conditions of virtually every other species in the world, and how they are fighting to preserve the planet's biodiversity.

Chaqueo is a Bolivian practice of burning down the forest in order to gain arable land. In 2019, this practice was made legal and fire was recognized as a legal tool for the cultivation of land. Soon after, the fires in the country got out of control. The movie introduces Chaqueo and shows the effort of voluntary firemen groups who are trying to save the most vulnerable places such as human settlements and nature reserves.

A sacrificed generation? At the beginning of 2019, young people are taking to the streets all over the world to warn of the climate emergency. In Switzerland, young people are demonstrating and questioning the system. As their voices begin to resonate, the arrival of the coronavirus in 2020 abruptly cuts their momentum and silences them. The film intimately follows these activists through the euphoria of the first demonstrations and the spleen of the health crisis. It asks us, young and old, about our relationship with this collapsing world and how we can envision a future for all generations together.

I'll show you places where climate change is already a reality today, but also young people with really good ideas, who really believe that we can still save the Earth and take matters into our own hands. People who surely save me, and maybe also you, from giving up.

More and more of the bottles, packets, sachets and containers we buy are proudly stamped with the words '100% recyclable'. Their packaging purchases are guilt-free. But something doesn't add up. In reality, almost none of the packages we buy are actually made from recycled material. Could recycling really be the ultimate greenwash?

Ode to Nature invites us to take stock and form an opinion at the end of the UN Decade of Biological Diversity. It is a visually stunning journey through the nature of Germany, from the mountains and alpine pastures to the coasts and the depths of the North and Baltic Seas. The film leaves the viewer with enchanting and surprising views of our own environment and with the realization that it is not too late to preserve and restore our natural world. The Anthropocene, the age of man, does not have to end in catastrophe. Nor does it have to lead to an inexorable loss of habitats and species.







THE UNRELENTING: UNDER THE SURFACE

The existence of highly radioactive waste from nuclear power plants means that we have to find a way to store it safely for hundreds of thousands of years. The question is not if, but where. Every country that uses nuclear power is bound by international treaties to take care of spent nuclear fuel in its territory. This, however, means that the countries will have to cope with technological requirements as well as major psychological, social and political barriers in the process of selecting the final storage site. The filmmakers talked to representatives of the state, activists, citizens and local governments of towns that have been shortlisted as potential locations of the deep nuclear waste repository.







THE CLIMATE DROPOUTS - LIFE WITHOUT ELECTRICITY AND RUNNING WATER

A film about a breathtakingly beautiful landscape in transition.

MEMORIES OF TREES. QUEÑOA, THE TREE FROM THE HEIGHTS

Chile

Queñoa is a tree that grows in the highest altitudes on the planet. Found in the Altiplano, it grows at up to 5200 meters above sea level. In this inhospitable climate with inclement radiation, the Queñoa feed on the dew and the sunlight at dawn. Afterwards, the tree completely closes its leaves to avoid evaporation. This way it saves energy and sleeps for the rest of the day. Its growth is slow, but it can live for up to 800 years. Its wood, dense and tortuous, has been used as an important fuel by the Andean people, but also for ancient mining, making it a scarce, endangered resource.

Speck shares the experience inside an intensive pig farm as told through the eyes of a camera hidden between buttons on a jacket. Factory farms are located far from populated centres, barely recognisable from countryside roads or along the highway. Even if we don't see them, there are many and they are not always accessible. This film allows us to enter a factory farm slowly and in first person, to experience its melancholy and witness a world that is so brutal that it can seem unreal.

What would happen if at some point, natural and human-made sounds became indistinguishable from one another? Today, birds imitate telephones and people put little chirping boxes in their homes. 



The meeting on "Learning by location or the magic and power of locally embedded learning" is for you. The village and its surroundings become the classroom, local experts and specialists enter the classroom, pupils are more actively involved in learning than usual, learning is more fun for all involved. We will talk about the experiences of Czech and foreign teachers. It explored four main natural wealth and industries of Donbas, telling Tales of Chalk, Salt, Coal, and Metal. Initially planned as a feature documentary, it now seeks its way to be implemented in different experimental formats - for example this exibition.



THINK OF FORESTS

3.-28. 10. 2022 FSS MU, ATRIUM

In 2021, the Czech FSC organised the 8th edition of the photo competition, where competitors sent almost 5,000 photographs this time. The 9 winning photographs (competed in three categories) will be available for visitors to view in large-format photographs.

The Think of Forests photo contest is one of the largest environmental photography competitions in the Czech Republic and focuses on promoting environmentally friendly forest management and responsible consumption of wood products.

SMOKEMAN'S ADVENTURE WITH FIRE AND PHYSICS,

OR THE TEN COMMANDMENTS OF A GOOD STOKER



SMOKEMAN's videos on the ten commandments of a proper stoker, accompanied by practical experimental demonstrations of physics in practice. We will be looking for answers to questions about where energy comes from or how we can use a torch called "wood" to make ourselves hotter and burn less. For example, we will show how much air a log of wood needs compared to the amount of air used by the children in the hall during the event, and we will try to charge a mobile phone with the energy contained in the wood.

EXCURSION AT THE INSTITUTE OF GLOBAL CHANGE RESEARCH OF THE ACADEMY OF SCIENCES OF THE CZECH REPUBLIC

We will introduce you to the issue of climate change, which is one of the biggest threats to humanity. During a visit to the isotope laboratory, you will learn what isotopic analysis can be used for and how climate leaves its "isotopic imprint" on plants. You will see growth chambers that allow plants to adapt to the conditions under which they grew in past times or what is expected in 100 years, for example. In the metabolomics lab. you will see how plant metabolic products are identified and quantified (metabolites) in response to changes in external conditions related to global change. Colleagues from the Remote Sensing Department will show you what can be learned from satellite and aerial data.



EXCURSION WITH OPEN HOUSE Brno: Ceitec Masaryk University




